Just like last month, you can drop by any Wednesday at sundown to catch a free outdoor flick chosen by MoMA's former senior curator of film, Laurence Kardish; HIP Lit returns to the backyard twice to present live readings from forward-thinking writers; and Think Olio is back in the house, this time with a very special four-parter on feminist theory and sexuality — and another active listening session with conductor and composer Whitney George (she's digging deep into the b-side of David Bowie's *Low*). We're showing more World Cup matches inside, and Liquid Liquid lead singer Sal P. is returning to whip up another vegan feast. We've got the usual good vibes every Sunday at Mister, with some of our favorite NYC selectors — Duane Harriott and Analog Soul — dropping by.

As for July 4th, we'll be hanging out back all day listening to good tunes (courtesy of Working Women), eating ribs, sipping brews and, later on, oohing and ahhhing at the fireworks our neighbors send up on all sides. If you want to start celebrating early, we've got Butter and a special guest playing tunes indoors on July 3rd starting at 8pm.

Our free Thursday night party series continues with a special stateside set from London's Secretsundaze duo, an edition of Douglas Sherman's *Adventures in Flight*, a night of choice selections from supreme collectors DJ Monchan and Dennis Kane and an eclectic groovathon with Fatik and Korea Town Acid.

We're kicking off our weekend jams with two artists from Mexico City-based label NAAFI, Debit and Tayhana, followed by Precolumbian and Bearcat's first-ever New York edition of their QTPOC-centered club night *Seltzer*. The next weekend, hometown hero Christy Love joins forces with NOLA's Babygirl for Sparkle Motion on July 13th, and Discwoman co-founder Umfang pushes the boundaries of techno all night on July 14th.

The rest of the month goes to some of our staple selectors here at the 'days. L.Sangre dishes up mutant sounds on July 20th, this time with assistance from Silent Servant. Allergy Season invites CCL and Person of Interest to throw down alongside label boss Physical Therapy on July 21st, and Fruits and Vegetables (aka JT Almon and Michael Magnan) host Gia on July 27th.

At the end of the month, we're teaming up with Resident Advisor to present the New York installment of its RA 24/7 series.
